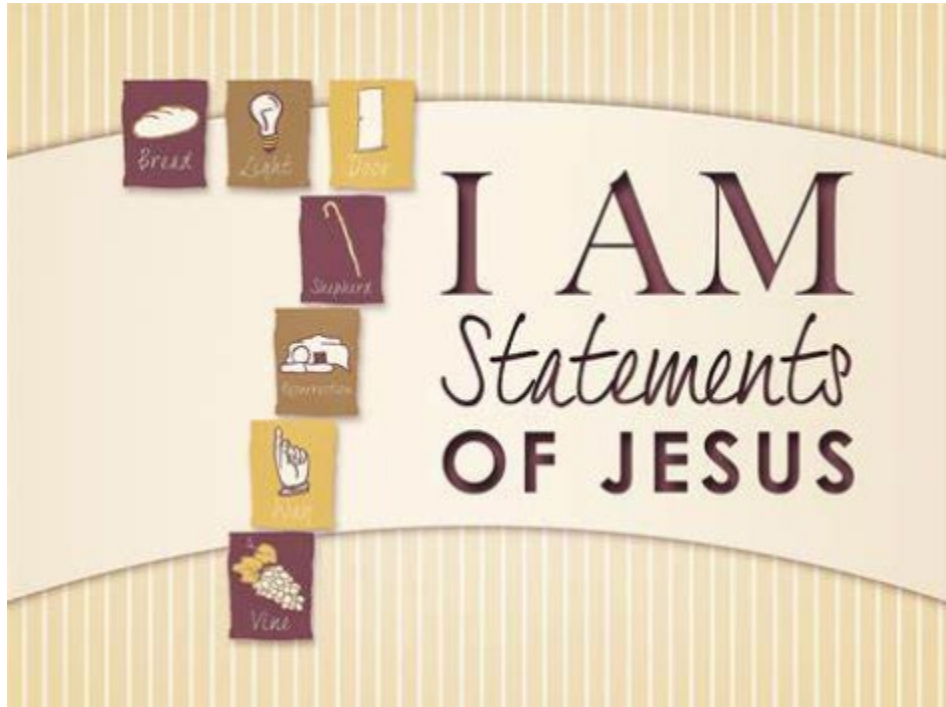

“I can do all things through Christ...”



“German festivals and horse markets?”

Germans love festivals. Most people are at least familiar with the famous *Oktoberfest* in Munich or the annual German *Weihnachtsmarkt* (Christmas markets), but what about the *Quirnbacher Pferdemarkt*? The photo above represents the tiny village of Quirnbach (pop 550) which is known for its *Pferdemarkt* “Horse Market” on the second Wednesday in November every year. No, they aren’t selling horses, but for one day 80+ vendors of all kinds come and sell their goods while people from far and wide gather in this small village to attend the *Quirnbacher Horse Market*. Famous for their great horse show and a lottery winner every year, the people of Quirnbach prepare to “burst at the seams” as their population grows exponentially for one day! They have recorded upwards of 30,000 people attending this festival on this single day of the year! Now that’s the German festival spirit.

To quote St. Paul at one of the most pivotal points in his ministry, “I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me” (Phil 4:13). He is testifying that Christ is the one who makes it possible for His ministry to go forward despite insurmountable odds. Unlike the way this verse is used by Christian gym-goers and enthusiastic, sports-oriented parents today, these words actually confess the source of St. Paul’s strength through trial and tribulation. He begins by saying just two verses prior that he has learned that he is not in need because the Lord supplies it all, whether full or hungry. Whether in abundance or need, it is the Lord who makes it all possible. How can St. Paul do all that the Lord has called him to do? How can he go spread the Gospel amid joy, pain, disapproval, and being beaten and thrown into prison, as he was in Philippi? He can endure this kind of suffering only because he can do it all through Christ. That is the secret of his strength. If it weren’t the Lord’s mission, he could not endure.

So, why then are the Domenichelli children holding up this verse on their phones to smile and show other vehicles and those walking along the road? This is the hope that they have within them. A few days before this photo was inspired, we had received a vehicle that would be adequate enough to take our whole family 117 km (73 miles) northwest to the town where we hope

to plant a church. Prior to receiving that gift, we did not know how we were going make it to Spangdahlem regularly to plant the seeds of the Gospel. However, this picture represented the joy they had that the Lord provides for the needs of His saints. Even more, in this photo they were joyful about the opportunity to tell others about Jesus.

These little saints have gone through a lot of changes so far, with a lot more to come. Like most missionary families, they have moved to an unfamiliar place around the world to tell people about Jesus. They all endure similar hardships. They leave friends, families and homeland to go to new places and new cultures, sometimes amidst populations and governments that are hostile to the Gospel.

Even though the Domenichelli children have only been missionary kids for a little while, they have met other missionary children who have endured a wide range of experiences. How did they all adapt? How did they cope with the changes that have been thrust upon their lives? They can endure all things through Christ who strengthens them. It is the Lord who provides. It is the Lord who builds up. It is the Lord who makes all things possible. Blessed be the name of the Lord.

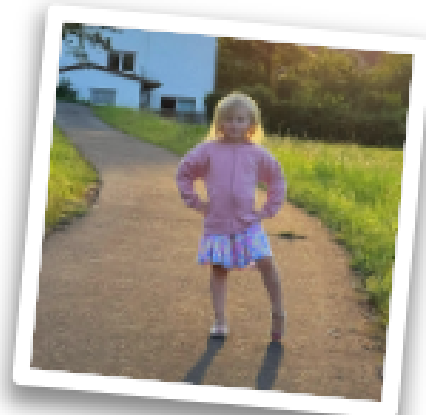

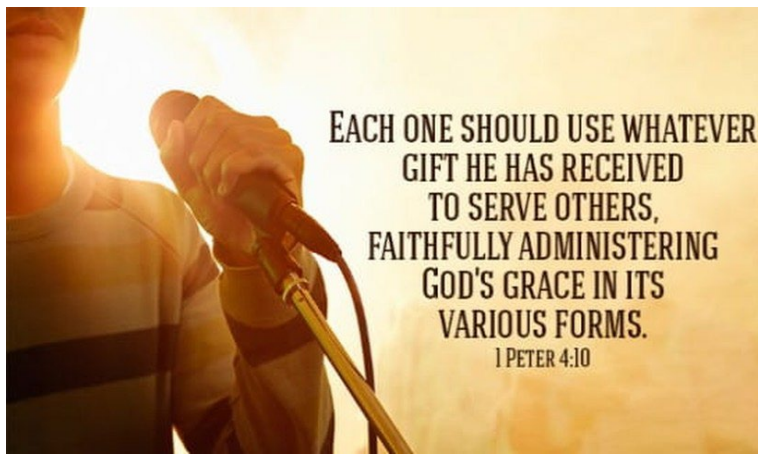

WEDDINGS AND ANNIVERSARIES

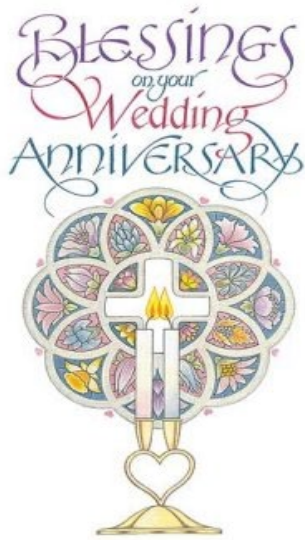
Prepare coffee/other beverages/food as directed by the family. *The family provides everything.

- ♥ Help arrange the serving table and see to it that it is always well supplied.
- ♥ Ask the family to provide waitresses to help serve coffee and pick up dirty dishes.
- ♥ Be sure that the coffee pots are put away clean and with the proper parts/cords together.
- ♥ The tablecloths and dish towels should be taken home and laundered.
- ♥ If the silver service is used, rinse out and dry thoroughly. Return to the proper bags for storage.
- ♥ Clean up the kitchen and put everything away.
- ♥ Check the kitchen for supplies; notify General Chairman of supplies needed.
- ♥ The janitor will put the chairs away.
- ♥ Monetary donations given to the groups for serving are optional. If received, the donation is deposited in St. Peters Kitchen Fund and used for kitchen upkeep and to replenish kitchen supplies.
