Are We Ready?

As we move into the month of December and the season of Advent, it is vital that we prepare—both for Christ's first coming as a lowly baby to save us, as well as His second coming in great glory with the holy angels to judge the living and the dead. Let's consider briefly what it means to be prepared and ready for that great Day of our Lord. As I perceive it, there are three vitally important elements to being ready.

First, **are we saved**? That is, are we sincere believers in the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? Have we been baptized into that holy name as Matthew 28:19 tells us? Do we trust in Christ—His person and His work—alone for our salvation? Do we realize that only He is the Savior of the world? "When He shall come with trumpet sound, Oh may I then in Him be found, Clothed in His righteousness alone, Redeemed to stand before His throne." (LSB #575, v. 4)

Second, **are we living a sanctified Christian life** as we await our Lord's return? That is, do we recognize that we are called to live separately from the world's standards of morality? We read in I Thessalonians 4:3-4: "It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control his own body in a way that is holy and honorable." God calls us to live holy lives. We do this by the guidance and grace of God's Holy Spirit, who is Himself holy and calls and enables us to be holy also.

Third, are we busy about the task of **serving others** in Jesus' name and **sharing the gospel** with those near and far? We are called not only to have faith and believe, but we are called to a life of good works. See Ephesians 2:8-10. While good works do not save us, nor does God need our good works, our neighbor needs them. As children of God and stewards of God's mysteries, we are all to be about the task of our congregation's mission: *"Give thanks to the Lord, call upon His name, and make known among the nations what He has done."* (Psalm 105:1)

Jesus puts it this way in Matthew 24:45-46: "Who then is the faithful and wise servant whom the master has put in charge of the servants in His household to give them their food at the proper time? It will be good for that servant whose master finds him doing so when he returns."

Fellow saved, sanctified, servants of the living Lord, God's grace to you this Advent as we prepare and eagerly look forward to His comings! Come, Lord Jesus!

A Gospel to Proclaim

I'm dreadfully embarrassed that I haven't posted to our blog in nearly a year. My apologies especially to anyone not on our mailing list who's been completely out of the loop during these past several months. I'm going to resist the urge to recap *everything* that's happened thus far in 2024, and keep it relatively brief here, with the intention of being more consistent in my posts going forward.

First, a quick summary: Our fifth son, Jensen, was born in February, followed closely by the death of my grandfather. In April, we made our first-ever trip to St. Louis. I attended a conference in nearby Collinsville, but we were all able to enjoy a few of the city's attractions. My supervising pastor and his wife graciously let us spend a week at their lake property in Minnesota in June, and Logan and Camden each attended summer camp for the first time. I completed my vicarage responsibilities at Our Redeemer and Peace on July 21. We can't say enough good things about our time there. After a week of visiting family, we picked up our truck from Cedar Falls and arrived back in Fort Wayne on July 30.

Since then, we've reconnected with some friends and resumed the activities we did our first two years here—namely, Classical Conversations for Pamela and the boys, Trail Life for Logan and Camden, and Seminary Women's Association for Pamela—as well as trying a few new things—flag football for Logan and Camden, percussion lessons for Logan, and more music ensembles on campus for me. Of course the big difference this year is the reality that our time here is now quite short. We're already wrapping up week eight of the 10-week fall quarter. It's an interesting time in the process, to say the least. Along the way, I'm taking every opportunity I can to keep one foot in the parish. I'm teaching Sunday school at Zion (our former fieldwork church), preached there for Reformation, and wrote an article for Mount Calvary's November newsletter. 

December 1st & 8th they will practice until 11:30 am.


December 15th & 22nd they will practice until 11:45 am.
